MAYOR'S UPDATE

Greetings and well wishes to all residents. On behalf of myself, the Common Council, and employees of the city, I want to extend a gracious thank you to Habitat for Humanity and all donors and volunteers that made the Rock the Block event in May a great success. Many of the city parks and facilities were the beneficiary of needed repairs and improvements. This work couldn't have been completed without your help. Thank You!

I want to also thank all residents for your patience and understanding while many of the city street, park, building, and sidewalk projects have been completed in the past months. I also need to inform all of you that more is forthcoming. Later this year, the East Main Street reconstruction project will begin. Construction will commence at the intersection at East Main and Commerce Streets and will continue all the way until Breed Street. The timeline for this project unfortunately will carry through the winter of 2023/2024, and the project will be completed by fall of 2024. Local traffic will be affected, and we are asking all residents to plan accordingly for this period so work can be completed in a safe and efficient manner.

Nennig Park will also be seeing significant work this fall. With the gracious donation of the Matt Kolbe Foundation, the city will start work on an all-inclusive playground area within Nennig Park. Demolition of aging basketball and volleyball courts and other earthwork will occur in fall of this year in preparation for a spring installation of the new play components. The project is expected to be completed early in 2024

Have you taken notice of the new Fire Department Building? Crews have been working this spring to make this project come to fruition. Completion of the project is expected in September. An open house and inaugural ceremony will be scheduled at a later date.

The Police Department headquarters and City Hall offices will also realize significant changes this fall. The former Fire Department will house a new squad room for the Police Department and will allow police vehicles to park indoors. The Administration window at City Hall and offices for staff will be improved to include security features that are now lacking.

As a reminder, located in this newsletter is information that will allow you as a resident to subscribe for email notifications from the city. You are allowed to pick the category or categories that pertain to you and your family. The information will alert you of city meeting schedules, emergencies, employment opportunities, park and recreation information, future events, and road closures. I suggest all of you take the time to subscribe to these updates and keep yourself informed of city matters.

As always, I encourage all residents to share input, ideas, and comments with myself, members of the common council and the city hall staff. My office hours at City Hall remain Monday and Wednesday mornings, and Tuesday afternoons. Enjoy the remaining summer months and all the City of Chilton has to offer.

Reminders for Pet Owners

As the weather gets nice, more pet owners will be out walking with their four legged friends. Here are a few reminders for pet owner's:

- Dog license year commences January 1 and ends on the following December 31. Dog licenses are required within 30 days after a dog reaches 5 months of age.
- Dogs Running at Large: No person who owns, harbors, keeps, or has under his/her control a dog, cat or other animal shall permit the same to run at large in the city at any time. Each person of such animal shall confine it within the limits of his/her premises except when it is attended by some person, and fastened securely by a suitable leash not more than ten (10) feet in length.
- No person shall own, harbor, or keep in his possession at anyone dwelling at anyone time more than a total of four dogs/cats or combination thereof over six months of age for more than three days or a litter longer than four months.

Lawn/Noxious Weeds Maintenance of Vegetation

Weed Ordinance 18-3 8(a)(b): Noxious weeds and rank growth of vegetation in excess of eight (8) inches in residential areas and 12 inches in undeveloped areas of commercial or industrial zoning. Any property owner in violation will receive a notice advising them to cut the weeds/vegetation within three (3) days from the date of the letter. If the weeds or vegetation is not cut the City can cut the weeds/vegetation and invoice the property owner for the service, along with other equipment fees if necessary. The 2023 weed cutting rate is \$80.00 per hour plus a 25% Administrative Fee. The property owner is only notified by letter once during the growing season. If the City received any future complaints, the weeds/vegetation will be cut without any further notification.

Grass Clippings Compliance

The City of Chilton is mandated by the Wisconsin DNR to assist in improving water quality in lakes, streams and drainage ways into which city storm sewers discharge. City streets, curbs, gutters and curb inlets are all portions of the storm water system which makes the blowing of grass and leaves onto streets, curbs and gutters illegal and enforceable through the Municipal Code 20-77(b) Littering Prohibited: No person shall cause grass, leaves or any form of yard waste to enter upon public property or upon any private property not owned by said person or upon the surface of any body of water within the city. Penalty for violators of this ordinance will be fined in excess of \$200 for each individual violation, and \$100 clean up fee.
